# MUSCAT INTERNATIONAL SHIPPING TRANSPORT BREAKBULK TO THE STATES


Muscat International Shipping & Logistics (MIS) are pleased to share details of a recently completed project shipment from Oman to the United States.


This project shipment consisted of **thirty-two pieces of breakbulk cargo** which included nine OOG FRs.

The cargo was loaded at **Sohar, Oman** on MSC Flagship, which was on her direct industry service maiden call to Sohar for this cargo only. The vessel was rerouted to Sohar to collect and carry this breakbulk cargo to the USA.

As well as complete handling of the cargo, MIS also performed the loading, lashing, customs clearance and transport to the port with a police escort.

# POLARIS PROJECTS COMPLETES KEY CONTRACTS IN JULY 2024

The project logistics division of **Polaris Shipping Agencies**, our members from the **United Arab Emirates** began July with a significant cross-trade contract involving shipments from multiple CIS destinations.

These shipments were consigned to Polaris for storage and refurbishment. Utilising their Jebel Ali Free Zone Logistics License, Polaris were able to import the shipments **duty-free** and **VAT-exempt** into the Jebel Ali Free Zone, with no time restrictions for export.

The project involved approximately **2,800 freight tons** of RO/RO units, each with a maximum unit weight of **25 MT**.

These units were meticulously inspected and refurbished at the Jebel Ali facility to meet the receiver's requirements before being shipped to **Myanmar**. To avoid additional charges at the destination, shipments were dispatched in multiple lots as per the receiver's instructions.

The shipments were made on container vessels using special equipment such as flat racks, open tops, and as breakbulk.

Polaris' scope of work covered the following:

- Collection from various suppliers in the CIS
- Multimodal transportation via Georgia and Turkey to Jebel Ali
- Receipt of units in the Jebel Ali Free Zone facility
- Condition surveys of all units upon receipt, refurbishment, and export, with direct reporting
- **Refurbishment** according to the receiver's requirements
- Coordination and arrangement of all inward and outward formalities
- Stuffing and lashing on special equipment for containerised units and delivery under tackle for breakbulk shipments
- Competitive ocean freight solutions to Port Myanmar



# ELEMENT INTERNATIONAL LOGISTICS DELIVER DRILLING MACHINES

Element International Logistics, our members from Türkiye, are pleased to report on a recent transport they completed involving drilling machines and plenty of spare parts.

The company received a request to deliver the drilling machines & spare parts to **Tripoli Port** in **Libya**.

- **1. Drilling Machine (2 PCS)**: 23.63 m x 3.00 m x 3.57 m **182 MT**
- 2. Pipes (5 PCS): 600 cm x 80 cm x 80 cm 2,900 kg
- 3. Kelly Ropes (2 PCS): 150 cm x 100 cm 800 kg
- 4. Tremie Pipes (5 PCS): 300 cm x 50 cm 600 kg
- 5. Kelly Bar (1 PCS): 1,200 cm x 60 cm 10 MT
- 6. Twister (1 PCS): 150 cm x 88 cm 1,300 kg

Thanks to their good relations with a shipowner, Element Logistics elected to use a **breakbulk vessel** for their customer's request.

After finding the most suitable date for this movement and its project vessel, they awaited approval from the customer before arranging for **pre-carriage** and **port operations**.

Element picked up the cargoes from **Hatay City**, south of Türkiye, using seven trucks and carriage to the loading port in **Izmit**.

Once loading onto the vessel was **carefully completed** with the aid of the port cranes, the ship sailed safely for **Tripoli Port**.

# UPCARGO SHARE NEWS AS PANAMA CANAL RETURNS TO 35 TRANSITS

Starting on **August 5th,** a new reservation slot has been added for the Neopanamax locks, bringing the total number of transits to **35 ships per day!** 

The **Panama Canal** announced through a Notice to Shipping that starting on August 5th, the **maximum authorised draft** for vessels transiting the Neopanamax locks will be **49.0 feet** (14.94 meters), based on the current and projected level of **Gatun Lake** for the coming weeks.

The canal had to adapt its operations due to the **prolonged drought** resulting from climate variations that impacted the levels of **Gatun and Alhajuela Lakes**.

Despite this situation, the past year has been one of adaptation, ensuring the supply of drinking water for the population while also **maintaining the reliability of service** to interoceanic transit customers.

"Additionally, as announced in June, a new reservation slot for the Neopanamax locks has been added as of today, bringing the total number of transits to 35 vessels per day."

The rainy season is gradually bringing the lakes to their optimal levels: Gatun is currently at **84.97 feet**, while Alhajuela is at **217.29 feet**.

The Panama Canal remains focused on improving **reliability**, **efficiency**, and **responsiveness** to the changing needs of the maritime industry while continuing to monitor Gatun Lake levels to announce future draft adjustments in a **timely manner**.

# 3P LOGISTICS TRANSSHIP SO2 WASHER TANK FROM POLAND TO GERMANY

**3p Logistics** continue to deliver good news - this time regarding the successful transport of a **SO2 Washer Tank** from **Gydnia, Poland** to **Hamburg, Germany**.

Due to bridges along the route and the dimensions of cargo - featuring a diameter of **five meters** - it was not possible to secure this transport by truck only.

Additionally, the sensitivity of the cargo meant it was too risky to **transship** the cargo **from vessel to barge to truck**.

The destination site was located next to a terminal on the same island, and 3p Logistics came up with a plan to use a **flat rack** to avoid touching the cargo during **transshipment**.

To avoid public roads and bridges, 3p Logistics positioned the cargo on the terminal **as close as possible** to the final delivery site, allowing their consignee to pick it up using a **crane**.
