
HEMISPHERE ACQUIRE TWO DIVISIONS OF MAGNUS GROUP

Hemisphere Freight Services are set to purchase the warehousing and freight forwarding elements of Magnus Group after it was announced that the group was intending to appoint administrators. The acquisition will see Hemisphere Freight Services take on Magnus Group's warehousing and forwarding divisions, as well as all associated operational staff.

The agreement aims to minimise business disruption to Magnus' clients, as well as provide continuous employment to their warehousing and forwarding team members. As part of the arrangement, Hemisphere will also take over circa

200,000 sq ft of warehousing space at Magnus Group's **Great Blakenham** facility, Twenty-five jobs will be saved as a result of the agreement, which was one of the key priorities for Hemisphere's board of directors ahead of the proposal to take over the business.

Andy Perrin, Hemisphere's Managing Director, said; "It's always hard to see a fellow family-run business go into administration, especially after decades of successful trading and becoming so well-respected within the local community. Our sincere condolences go out to everyone affected at what must be an incredibly difficult time.





This is a sad reflection of the current state of the industry and economic conditions, and our offer to acquire the warehousing and forwarding elements of the business was, above all else, an attempt to safeguard the employment and ensure the wellbeing of as many of Magnus Group's team members as possible - particularly in the run-up to Christmas, when many households are feeling the strain.

We are incredibly excited to be able to welcome the new team members to the Hemisphere family and to strengthen the exceptional service we've always offered our clients."

The purchase of the two Magnus Group divisions comes at an exciting time for Hemisphere Freight Services as they prepare to open a **new multi-million pound warehouse** on the Suffolk **Port One Logistics Park** development (**read more**).

The site is set for build and completion by Q1 2024, and will enable the business to provide 34,750 racked pallet locations, which stack nine levels high, and an additional 8,000 bulk loaded pallets on floors and mezzanines.

Hemisphere's **Director, Craig Perrin**, has said that the acquisition comes at a pivotal moment in the business' growth:

"This deal creates the opportunity to add some fantastic people to our team, as well as add a number of new

clients to our portfolio, enabling us to demonstrate our exceptional customer service and form new relationships which will hopefully last for many years to come. The priority for us is to minimise disruption on both sides and ensure that Magnus Group's current client base is well informed and well taken care of throughout this process.

Hemisphere's team will utilise warehousing space in Great Blakenham for six months in the build up to their new **Port One** site, before transitioning the business to the new site immediately upon completion.

The Hemisphere team has thanked Magnus Group's suppliers for their cooperation and willingness to help get the agreement over the line, along with The Access Group, Kennedy Wilson and Larking Gowen. The team has also praised their solicitors, Keystone Law, as well as Ellisons, who have worked on behalf of Magnus Group, for making the process as seamless as possible.

Louis Perrin, Director at Hemisphere, added:

"At our core we are a family business, which has grown into a major logistics provider, and our growing success is largely attributed to our amazingly dedicated team. With us welcoming 25 new employees across the warehousing and forwarding sectors, we see this as a significant enhancement to our abilities to service both our existing and new clients alike."



GLOBAL LOGISTICS PROJECTS ARRANGE MULTIMODAL TRANSPORT TO SPAIN

Global Logistics Projects, our members from Switzerland, are glad to share a multimodal heavy lift transport they recently completed to Bilbao, Spain. The cargo for this delivery involved a B6 tamping machine, which was measured at 31.7 (H) x 3.1 (W) x 5.2 (H) meters and featured a weight of approximately 139.25 tons.

It was picked up in **Crissier, Switzerland** by Global Logistics Projects with its destination site in **Villada, Spain**. Unfavourable weather conditions created challenges for the company, with heavy rain leading

to an almost two-hour delay in transit. Additionally, special instructions required the closure of the tram and bus lines throughout Lausanne the night before to facilitate the movement.

Global Logistics Projects made this delivery on DDP terms with unloading completed by two cranes on the railway tracks.

MEGALIFT DELIVERS FOR AIR SEPARATION UNIT PROJECT IN MALAYSIA


Megalift are pleased to report on an ASU project they played a hand in, involving the construction of a large manufacturing plant in **Bayan Lepas, Penang**.

The company have been handling several deliveries for this same project since early this year. This particular shipment contained **sixty-three packages**, with the largest being a cold box which they received in **Penang Port.**

The cold box featured dimensions of 40.11 (L) x 5.00 (W) x 3.65 (H) meters and weighed 127 tons. Other items included ducts, platforms, coolers and joints.

"Our current deliveries to the site are being carried out in batches."





EZ LINK DELIVER HEAVY MACHINERY BY VESSEL FROM TAIWAN TO BRAZIL

EZ Link are proud to share a request they recently met from a client involving the transport of heavy machinery, which was shipped from **Kaohsiung Port** in **Taiwan** to **Port Santos** in **Brazil**.

The two units of machinery featured dimensions of 9.9 (L) x 4.2 (W) x 3.5 (H) meters and 4.2 (L) x 3.1 (W) x 3.3 (H) meters, with weights of 123 WT and 8.5 WT respectively.

Due to their client's need for an urgent schedule within which to move their heavy cargo, EZ Link provided a solution by utilising a heavy lift charter vessel with enhanced lifting points and a crane lift for the cargo.

This ensured the strict timeframe was met and the client's requirements were satisfied.

"Our arrangement for the cargo allowed it to arrive safely and on-time as per our client's request, leaving them happy with EZ Link's 'timely and reliable service' as always."

LOGISTICS PLUS HANDLE HUGE VOLUME OF CARGO FOR MAJOR PROJECT

TERA PROJECTS & SHIPPING HANDLE TRANSPORT OF HUGE PIPELINE REELS

Tera Projects & Shipping were recently appointed to handle the transport of **huge flexible pipeline reels**, along with some accessories, from Binzhou in China to Johor Bahru, Malaysia.

This shipment comprised of four pieces, with the largest reel measuring 10.00 x 6.77 x 10.00m. The cargo was loaded at the client's private jetty in Binzhou before eventually being lifted and loaded onto a self-propelled barge utilising a 350th capacity floating crane.

The self-propelled barge then departed to Taicang Port to undergo a **ship-to-ship transfer operation** berthed alongside a chartered heavy-lift vessel.

The heavy-lift vessel then left for Johor Port to unload the reels onto a double wide multi-axle trailer to be delivered onto concrete stools at the temporary storage yard. Following this, the reels were jacked up and shifted to the wharf side before lifting and loading onto a multipurpose offshore vessel using the vessel's crane.

EXG DELIVERS FOUR HEAT EXCHANGERS FROM INDIA TO EGYPT

The complexity of handling such massive cargo requires meticulous planning and execution.

ATS NETHERLANDS WITH OVERSIZED MULTIMODAL SHIPMENT TO BANGLADESH

ATS Netherlands are pleased to report on a recent project they recently handled from **Germany** to Chittagong in **Bangladesh**.

When ATS Netherlands received the request for this movement, it turned out that another forwarder had been offered but rejected the project. It proved a major challenge for ATS Netherlands to match the existing quotation, but after performing the necessary research they managed to provide their customer with

the desired shipping method with CMA-CGM.

They used a single **20" flat rack** (5.2 meter width), as well as three **40" flat racks** (4.6 meter width). Most of the cargo was from shippers in Germany - where the cargo travelled initially by barge to **Rotterdam**, before being loaded directly onto the flat racks.

"During the night, we transported the loaded flat racks by road transport to the export terminal, where everything will leave for Bangladesh."


MUSCAT INTERNATIONAL SHIPPING DELIVER GAS TANK IN OMAN




